# ADVENT & CHRISTMAS 2024 Services and Events



The days running up to Christmas can be frenetic. We may experience excitement and panic in equal measure as we search for presents, write Christmas cards, plan exotic menus and make arrangements to catch up with family and friends. In theory, Advent is a time of quiet reflection and joyful hope as we prepare for the birth of Christ, but in practice, it is rarely like that. It is impossible to insulate ourselves from the commercialisation of the season. Any talk about waiting on God in prayer and quiet expectation may be puzzling in our streets, but this is what is at the heart of the season of Advent.

Underneath the glitz and glitter of December are echoes of a more sombre season during which, traditionally, Christians have contemplated the so-called 'Four Last Things': death, judgement, heaven and hell. It is why the readings from the Bible this month are full of courtroom imagery, and the language of judgement. It is a time for taking stock, but it is also a time of hope: hope in the God who comes to meet us in his Son Jesus Christ, the Word-made-flesh.
