### THE COLLECT

Almighty God, whose Son Jesus Christ is the resurrection and the life: raise us, who trust in him, from the death of sin to the life of righteousness, that we may seek those things which are above, where he reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. **Amen.** 

#### FIRST READING Acts 9.36-end

Now in Joppa there was a disciple whose name was Tabitha, which in Greek is Dorcas. She was devoted to good works and acts of charity. At that time she became ill and died. When they had washed her, they laid her in a room upstairs. Since Lvdda was near Joppa, the disciples, who heard that Peter was there, sent two men to him with the request, 'Please come to us without delay.' So Peter got up and went with them; and when he arrived, they took him to the room upstairs. All the widows stood beside him. weeping and showing tunics and other clothing that Dorcas had made while she was with them. Peter put all of them outside, and then he knelt down and prayed. He turned to the body and said, 'Tabitha, get up.' Then she opened her eves, and seeing Peter, she sat up. He gave her his hand and helped her up. Then calling the saints and widows, he showed her to be alive. This became known throughout Joppa, and many believed in the Lord. Meanwhile he stayed in Joppa for some time with a certain Simon, a tanner.

#### GOSPEL READING John 10.22-30

At that time the festival of the Dedication took place in Jerusalem. It was winter, and Jesus was walking in the temple, in the portico of Solomon. So the Jews gathered around him and said to him, 'How long will you keep us in suspense? If you are the Messiah,\* tell us plainly.' Jesus answered, 'I have told you, and you do not believe. The works that I do in my Father's name testify to me; but you do not believe, because you do not belong to my sheep. My sheep hear my voice. I know them, and they follow me. I give them eternal life, and they will never perish. No one will snatch them out of my hand. What my Father has given me is greater than all else, and no one can snatch it out of the Father's hand.\* The Father and I are one."

For many, a sense of belonging is deeply rooted in place, and this connection is frequently expressed through the church's services and events. In that spirit, I invite you to be part of our shared life through events such as concerts, the Wednesday community café, and other regular gatherings. We're also planning an Open Day and a Cream Tea afternoon hopefully with the aid of young musicians in the community, and of course, the much-loved Street Market is very much in our sights. **UPDATE FROM OUR TREASURER - I wanted** to thank the congregation for early signs from the first three months of 2025 that overall giving has started to increase after a long period when it has been static or declining - this is very welcome and hopefully this trend will be continued. We are also doing well on lettings income, partly due to the current closure of St Margaret's Hall and the new income generation group under Lindsey Driscoll has had its first meeting, so some encouraging developments. The context though remains challenging with a first quarter deficit of £11 thousand. The position should improve over the course of the year but we are still likely to have a deficit that is better than the £25 thousand last year but around £15-20 thousand. Ideally we should reduce the deficit to around £15 thousand this year and aim to eliminate it in 2026 to then free funds up for the backlog of fabric repairs.
