FIRST READING Proverbs 8.1-4, 22-31

Does not wisdom call, and does not understanding raise her voice? On the heights, beside the way, at the crossroads she takes her stand; beside the gates in front of the town, at the entrance of the portals she cries out: 'To you, O people, I call, and my cry is to all that live. The Lord created me at the beginning of his work, the first of his acts of long ago. Ages ago I was set up, at the first, before the beginning of the earth. When there were no depths I was brought forth, when there were no springs abounding with water. Before the mountains had been shaped, before the hills, I was brought forthwhen he had not vet made earth and fields. or the world's first bits of soil. When he established the heavens, I was there, when he drew a circle on the face of the deep, when he made firm the skies above, when he established the fountains of the deep, when he assigned to the sea its limit, so that the waters might not transgress his command, when he marked out the foundations of the earth, then I was beside him, like a master worker; and I was daily his delight, rejoicing before him always, rejoicing in his inhabited world and delighting in the human race.

MESSAGE FROM JENNY - Everything You Ever Wanted to Know About Churchwardens!

Our Churchwardens are at the heart of our church family, working quietly and faithfully alongside the clergy and Parochial Church Councils (PCCs), offering their time, energy, and love to help our churches thrive practically and spiritually. The role of Churchwarden goes back to the 13th century and is one of the Church of England's oldest and most trusted forms of lay leadership. Today, over 900 Churchwardens serve across the Diocese of Salisbury, elected each year at parish meetings and formally welcomed at special services of blessing and commissioning. Attending this week's Visitation and Admissions of Churchwardens Service at St Denys, The Minster Church, Warminster, alongside our Benefice Churchwardens was an absolute joy. These occasions are a powerful reminder that Churchwardens are not just stewards of church buildings, but shepherds of parish community life, encouragers of faith, and ministry partners. Their responsibilities are wide-ranging: they help care for our buildings and churchvards. support the clergy and lay ministry teams, nurture the church's life, and help foster a spirit of welcome, peace, and unity. In all

they do, Churchwardens are rooted in the love of Christ. Today is also a day of celebration: not only is it Father's Day, but it is also the Patronal Festival of Holy Trinity!
