COLLECT

Almighty God, who in the passion of your blessed Son made an instrument of painful death to be for us the means of life and peace: grant us so to glory in the cross of Christ that we may gladly suffer for his sake; who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. **Amen.**

We include for wider reading, the readings for the Thirteenth Sunday After Trinity, (the service of Holy Communion according to the Book of Common Prayer at 8am).

EPISTLE READING (BCP) Philippians 2. 6-11

Jesus Christ, who, though he was in the form of God, did not regard equality with God as something to be exploited, but emptied himself, taking the form of a slave, being born in human likeness. And being found in human form, he humbled himself and became obedient to the point of death—even death on a cross.

Therefore God also highly exalted him and gave him the name that is above every name, so that at the name of Jesus every knee should bend, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and every tongue should confess that Jesus Christ is Lord. to the glory of God the Father.

GOSPEL READING (BCP) John 3, 13-17

Jonn 3. 13-17

No one has ascended into heaven except the one who descended from heaven, the Son of Man. And just as Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, so must the Son of Man be lifted up, that whoever believes in him may have eternal life. "For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not perish but may have eternal life. "Indeed, God did not send the Son into the world to condemn the world, but in order that the world might be saved through him.

The readings for the 9.30am at Holy Trinity are included in a special Order of Service: 'In the Round with Holy Baptism in A Time for Creation'.

FIRST READING (9.30am) Isaiah 42. 5-9

Thus says God, the Lord, who created the heavens and stretched them out, who spread out the earth and what comes from it, who gives breath to the people upon it and spirit to those who walk in it: I am the Lord, I have called you in righteousness, I have taken you by the hand and kept you; I have given you as a covenant to the people, a light to the nations, to open the eyes that are blind, to bring out the prisoners from the dungeon, from the prison those who sit in darkness. I am the Lord, that is my name; my glory I give to no other, nor my praise to idols. See, the former things have comes to pass, and new things I now declare; before they spring forth, I tell you of them.

GOSPEL READING (9.30am) Luke 3. 15-17, 21, 22

As the people were filled with expectation, and all were questioning in their hearts concerning John, whether he might be the Messiah, John answered all of them by saying, 'I baptise you with water, but one who is more powerful than I is coming; I am not worthy to untie the thong of his sandals. He will baptise you with the Holy Spirit and fire. His winnowing fork is in his hand, to clear his threshing floor and to gather the wheat into his granary; but the chaff he will burn with unquenchable fire. Now when all the people were baptised, and when Jesus also had been baptised and was

praying, the heaven was opened, and the Holy Spirit descended upon him in bodily form like a dove. And a voice came from heaven, 'You are my Son, the Beloved; with you I am well pleased.'

POST COMMUNION PRAYER

Faithful God, whose Son bore our sins in his body on the tree and gave us this sacrament to show forth his death until he comes: give us grace to glory in the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ, for he is our salvation, our life and our hope, who reigns as Lord, now and for ever. **Amen.**

CHORAL EVENSONG, TONIGHT @ 6PM WITH NORDIC

VOICES - This will be a hugely enjoyable 'cathedral style' Choral Evensong and we're delighted to have Kevin Duggan and Nordic Voices back with us this year. Please come and support them as they sing Monteverdi, Herbert Howells and Buxtehude for us along with three great hymns for us in which, of course, we can all join – and you won't get that at many cathedral Evensongs!

Herbert Howells (1892-1983) was one of the foremost English composers of the last century with a very special feel for the spacious acoustic afforded the performers and listeners in our great churches and cathedrals. Of his many settings of the Magnificat and Nunc Dimittis, those for St Paul's Cathedral, Gloucester Cathedral and for King's College, Cambridge - evocatively named Collegium Regale - are perhaps the best known and the most cherished by church music lovers. Come and hear the Collegium Regale setting at Holy Trinity this evening. Actually, it's going to be a bit of a Howells fest, because not only are we singing his glorious hymn tune 'Michael' - All my hope on God is founded – but Martin is playing two of his beautifully atmospheric 'Psalm Preludes' before the service - (so come in good time) - and then his hugely exciting 'Paean' as the closing voluntary. All of this is leavened, of course, by by going back in time to music by Dietrich Buxtehude and Claudio Monteverdi.

MESSAGE FROM JENNY - This Sunday, we rejoice with Poppy and her family as she is baptised. Isaiah speaks of God's renewal: light in darkness, freedom for captives, creation restored. Luke tells how Jesus' baptism revealed the Spirit of new creation. In baptism, we too are named beloved and called into God's renewing work. Today, we promise to walk with Poppy and her family as a community of faith, prayer, and belonging, Together, in this Creation season, we celebrate God's gift of new beginnings. It is a joy also to share 'tea and toast' with our younger people on Thursday afternoons, and I look forward to school collective worship at Fitzmaurice Primary and St Laurence, sharing faith, connecting with these school communities on behalf of Holy Trinity, Westwood and Wingfield. Our thoughts turn too to Holy Cross Day, when we pause before the mystery of the cross: not as a sign of defeat, but as the 'tree of life' in this Time for Creation, where God's love is revealed most fully in Jesus Christ. The cross is a paradox: to the world, it seems a symbol of suffering, yet it is also a sign of hope, healing, and salvation. Each time we gather at the cross, we place ourselves afresh within the love that holds, forgives, and sends us out in Christ's way of service and compassion. Thank you to all who serve and contribute in any way at all. Your dedication and commitment sustain our church family. "Lift high the cross. the love of Christ proclaim, till all the world adore his sacred name."

FINANCE UPDATE - As we are heading into Autumn, I wanted to give a brief update on the Parish's finances. In summary, we are making progress in reducing the annual deficit in the General Fund but we need to do more to get to breakeven in 2026 and then focus on raising funds for addressing the backlog in fabric work.

You may recall that our deficit in 2024 was £25,682. Due to some generous gifts, increased regular congregation giving, healthy Church lettings and a successful Street Market, I anticipate that the 2025 deficit will be reduced to around £12,500. In order to reduce this further in 2026 to achieve breakeven in the General Fund, we need to build on the increased giving we have seen this year, continue a high level of Church lettings and work on further fund raising events as well as hopefully benefit from one-off gifts. On the fabric side, work is underway to obtain quotes for a small number of the most urgent repairs which will be financed by the current funds we have in our Fabric Fund. We also anticipate that the Church gates will be repaired and repainted, funded by a generous offer, to match the new lantern fitted over the summer

As a reminder, our preferred method of receiving giving is through the Parish Giving Scheme - the website address for this, where you can set up a payment is:

GRAPPLING WITH JONAH COURSE - Following the publication of his book Bewilderment: A Spiritual Guide, Bishop Robert continues this exciting and memorable course this week. The last session is on 17 September - Meeting the God of compassion and love

No previous knowledge is necessary, but if you have a Bible (any translation), please bring it with you.

We think of prophets as strong and confident figures, but Jonah is neither of these. In fact, he's barely taken seriously at all and is crowded out of his own story by the whale that swallowed him up. Alone among the prophets, Jesus describes Jonah as a 'sign'. But what does that mean, and does it have any relevance to us today? Come and find out. Jonah offers much wisdom for our bewildered generation one that grapples with anxiety, isolation, protest, anger, fear, and depression, all under the shadow of divine presence in the midst of personal turmoil. For those who feel unmoored, Jonah's story becomes a surprising source of consolation. Ultimately, it maps the contours of grace. We thank Bishop Robert for sharing his wisdom with us.
