FIRST READING

Acts 2. 42 – end

They devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and fellowship, to the breaking of bread and the prayers.
Awe came upon everyone, because many wonders and signs were being done by the apostles. All who believed were together and had all things in common; they would sell their possessions and goods and distribute the proceeds to all, as any had need. Day by day, as they spent much time together in the temple, they broke bread at home and ate their food with glad and generous hearts, praising God and having the goodwill of all the people. And day by day the Lord added to their number those who were being saved.

GOSPEL READING

John 10. 1 – 10

'Very truly, I tell you, anyone who does not enter the sheepfold by the gate but climbs in by another way is a thief and a bandit. The one who enters by the gate is the shepherd of the sheep. The gatekeeper opens the gate for him, and the sheep hear his voice. He calls his own sheep by name and leads them out. When he has brought out all his own, he goes ahead of them, and the sheep follow him because they know his voice. They will not follow a stranger, but they will run from him because they do not know the voice of strangers.' Jesus used this figure of speech with them, but they did not understand what he was saying to them.
So again Jesus said to them, 'Very truly, I tell you, I am the gate for the sheep. All who came before me are thieves and bandits; but the sheep did not listen to them. I am the gate. Whoever enters by me will be saved, and will come in and go out and find pasture. The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy. I came that they may have life, and have it abundantly.'

MESSAGE FROM JENNY –

Recognising the Shepherd's Voice
Acts 2.42–47; John 10.1–10

There is a difference between hearing a voice and recognising it. Recognition is formed through relationship, through trust, familiarity, and love. In the Gospel of John, Christ the Good Shepherd calls his sheep by name, and they follow because they know his voice. The life of faith is a life of discernment, of learning to distinguish the voice that leads to life from those that diminish and divide. In Acts of the Apostles, the early Christians devote themselves to the apostles' teaching, fellowship, the breaking of bread and prayer. Their shared life, marked by generosity and gladness, is a response to the voice they have come to trust. Jesus speaks of abundant life as fullness in relationship with God and one another. This life takes shape in communities that resist isolation and embody care. Through scripture, prayer, and the sacrament of the Eucharist, we learn to recognise Christ's voice more clearly, and in following it, are drawn into the life Jesus gives, which is abundant, shared and rooted in love.
