GOSPEL READING

Matthew 14. 13 - 21

Now when Jesus heard this, he withdrew from
there in a boat to a deserted place by himself. But
when the crowds heard it, they followed him on
foot from the towns. When he went ashore, he
saw a great crowd; and he had compassion for
them and cured their sick. When it was evening,
the disciples came to him and said, 'This is a
deserted place, and the hour is now late; send the
crowds away so that they may go into the villages
and buy food for themselves.' Jesus said to them,
'They need not go away; you give them
something to eat.' They replied, 'We have nothing
here but five loaves and two fish.' And he said,
'Bring them here to me.' Then he ordered the
crowds to sit down on the grass. Taking the five

loaves and the two fish, he looked up to heaven,
and blessed and broke the loaves, and gave them
to the disciples, and the disciples gave them to
the crowds. And all ate and were filled; and they
took up what was left over of the broken pieces,
twelve baskets full. And those who ate were about
five thousand men, besides women and children.

MESSAGE FROM JENNY –

What are we truly hungry for?

Through the prophet Isaiah, God calls to all who
thirst: "Come to the waters." God's invitation is not
reserved for those who have everything, but for
those who know their need. God offers the gift
that cannot be bought: a love that satisfies and a
covenant that endures. In today's Gospel, Jesus
meets a hungry crowd in a deserted place. The
disciples see only what is lacking: five loaves and
two fish. Jesus sees what can be offered. Taking
the small gift placed before him, he gives thanks,
breaks the bread, and shares it until everyone has
enough, with twelve baskets of fragments left
over. The miracle reveals the heart of God, whose
generosity is not measured by what we bring, but
by what he can do with it. Christ who took,
blessed, broke and gave the bread continues to
receive the offerings of our lives, our joys, our
sorrows, our hopes and our needs, and fills them
with his grace. Today we are invited to come to
Christ, the one who truly satisfies, trusting that
nothing offered into Christ's hands is ever wasted.
What may seem small or incomplete can, by his
grace, become a blessing for others.

May we be rooted in God's love, generous in
sharing what we have received and always
growing as disciples of Christ.

SUMMER ORGAN CONCERT

As we continue to celebrate the centenary of our Henry Willis organ, on Saturday 29th August, we will welcome Timothy Parsons, to give a concert at 5.00pm. Tim is Director of Music at Wells Cathedral and is presenting a programme of great interest and variety. A major item will be one of Bach's greatest organ works, the Passacaglia and Fugue in C minor. Like David Halls, in June, Tim is including one of Mendelssohn's Organ Sonatas - this time, the uplifting one in A major. If the name of the French organist and composer Jehan Alain, is not familiar to you, then it will be because he was killed in WW2, in 1940. His name is commemorated in the wonderful and really exciting, 'Prélude et Fugue sur le nom d'Alain', by Maurice Duruflé. With shorter works by Edward Elgar, Ghislane Reece-Trapp and Nico Muhly interspersed, this will be a memorable and unmissable occasion at Holy Trinity of the very finest organ music and playing by Tim. Tickets are £15 and this includes a glass of wine or a soft drink during the interval. So, unlike David Halls' event, this begins at 5.00pm with a 20 minute interval.
