FIRST READING

1 Kings 3. 5 - 12

At Gibeon the Lord appeared to Solomon in a dream by night; and God said, 'Ask what I should give you.' And Solomon said, 'You have shown great and steadfast love to your servant my father David, because he walked before you in faithfulness, in righteousness, and in uprightness of heart towards you; and you have kept for him this great and steadfast love, and have given him a son to sit on his throne today. And now, O Lord my God, you have made your servant king in place of my father David, although I am only a little child; I do not know how to go out or come in. And your servant is in the midst of the people whom you have chosen, a great people, so numerous they cannot be numbered or counted. Give your servant therefore an understanding mind to govern your people, able to discern between good and evil; for who can govern this your great people?'

It pleased the Lord that Solomon had asked this. God said to him, 'Because you have asked this,

and have not asked for yourself long life or riches, or for the life of your enemies, but have asked for yourself understanding to discern what is right, I now do according to your word. Indeed I give you a wise and discerning mind; no one like you has been before you and no one like you shall arise after you.

GOSPEL READING

Matthew 13. 31 - 33, 44 - 52

He put before them another parable: 'The kingdom of heaven is like a mustard seed that someone took and sowed in his field; it is the smallest of all the seeds, but when it has grown it is the greatest of shrubs and becomes a tree, so that the birds of the air come and make nests in its branches.'

He told them another parable: 'The kingdom of heaven is like yeast that a woman took and mixed in with three measures of flour until all of it was leavened.'

'The kingdom of heaven is like treasure hidden in a field, which someone found and hid; then in his joy he goes and sells all that he has and buys that field.

'Again, the kingdom of heaven is like a merchant in search of fine pearls; on finding one pearl of great value, he went and sold all that he had and bought it.

'Again, the kingdom of heaven is like a net that was thrown into the sea and caught fish of every kind; when it was full, they drew it ashore, sat down, and put the good into baskets but threw out the bad. So it will be at the end of the age. The angels will come out and separate the evil from the righteous and throw them into the furnace of fire, where there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth.

'Have you understood all this?' They answered, 'Yes.' And he said to them, 'Therefore every scribe who has been trained for the kingdom of heaven is like the master of a household who brings out of his treasure what is new and what is old.'

MESSAGE FROM JENNY

What would you ask of God if anything were possible? Solomon asks neither for riches nor power, but for a listening heart, a heart wise enough to recognise God's will and to serve

others with justice. It is a prayer that never grows old.

Jesus' parables invite us to see with that same wisdom. The kingdom of heaven begins like the smallest seed, works quietly like yeast in dough, and yet transforms everything it touches. It is a treasure hidden in a field, a pearl beyond price, worth surrendering everything else to possess. God's kingdom is often overlooked by those seeking the spectacular, yet it is discovered by those whose hearts are open to God's presence. Wisdom, then, is not simply knowledge. It is the grace to recognise what truly matters. It is the gift of seeing God's work in the ordinary, valuing eternal treasures above passing rewards and ordering our lives accordingly.

As we gather for worship today, may we make Solomon's prayer our own. May God give us listening hearts to recognise God's kingdom, and faithful lives that reveal its treasure to the world. Yours, Jenny

SUMMER ORGAN CONCERT

As we continue to celebrate the centenary of the Holy Trinity Henry Willis organ, on Saturday 29th August, we will welcome Timothy Parsons, to give a concert at 5.00pm. Tim is Director of Music at Wells Cathedral and is presenting a programme of great interest and variety. A major item will be one of Bach's greatest organ works, the Passacaglia and Fugue in C minor. Like David Halls, in June, Tim is including one of Mendelssohn's Organ Sonatas - this time, the uplifting one in A major. If the name of the French organist and composer Jehan Alain, is not familiar to you, then it will be because he was killed in WW2, in 1940. His name is commemorated in the wonderful and really exciting, 'Prélude et Fugue sur le nom d'Alain', by Maurice Duruflé. With shorter works by Edward Elgar, Ghislane Reece-Trapp and Nico Muhly interspersed, this will be a memorable and unmissable occasion at Holy Trinity of the very finest organ music and playing by Tim. Tickets are £15 and this includes a glass of wine or a soft drink during the interval. So, unlike David Halls' event, this begins at 5.00pm with a 20 minute interval. Tickets from the Annie
