FIRST READING

Zechariah 9. 9 - 12

Rejoice greatly, O daughter Zion!
Shout aloud, O daughter Jerusalem!
Lo, your king comes to you;
triumphant and victorious is he,
humble and riding on a donkey,
on a colt, the foal of a donkey.
He will cut off the chariot from Ephraim
and the warhorse from Jerusalem;
and the battle-bow shall be cut off,
and he shall command peace to the nations;
his dominion shall be from sea to sea,
and from the River to the ends of the earth.
As for you also, because of the blood of my
covenant with you,
I will set your prisoners free from the
waterless pit.
Return to your stronghold, O prisoners of hope;
today I declare that I will restore to you
double.

GOSPEL READING

Matthew 11.16 -19; 25 - end

'But to what will I compare this generation? It is
like children sitting in the market-places and
calling to one another,

"We played the flute for you, and you did not
dance;
we wailed, and you did not mourn."

For John came neither eating nor drinking, and
they say, "He has a demon"; the Son of Man
came eating and drinking, and they say, "Look,
a glutton and a drunkard, a friend of tax-
collectors and sinners!" Yet wisdom is
vindicated by her deeds.'

At that time Jesus said, 'I thank you, Father,
Lord of heaven and earth, because you have
hidden these things from the wise and the
intelligent and have revealed them to infants;
yes, Father, for such was your gracious will. All
things have been handed over to me by my
Father; and no one knows the Son except the
Father, and no one knows the Father except
the Son and anyone to whom the Son chooses
to reveal him.

'Come to me, all you that are weary and are
carrying heavy burdens, and I will give you
rest. Take my yoke upon you, and learn from
me; for I am gentle and humble in heart, and
you will find rest for your souls. For my yoke is
easy, and my burden is light.'

Grant, O Lord, we beseech you,
that the course of this world may be so
peaceably ordered by your governance,
that your Church may joyfully serve you in all
godly quietness;
through Jesus Christ our Lord.

MESSAGE FROM JENNY –

Prisoners of hope' is one of the most beautiful
phrases in the Bible. In Zechariah, God's
people are described as held not by fear or
despair, but by the quiet conviction that God's
promises are stronger than whatever they're
facing. That hope finds its shape in the humble
King who comes riding on a donkey, bringing
peace rather than power, and putting an end to
war instead of stirring it up. In Matthew, Jesus
shows that same strength, welcoming the
weary and inviting them to find rest in him.
God's kingdom rarely looks the way we expect.
It isn't something we manage through success
or status; it's something we receive with open
hands. The King who comes in peace is also
the one who says, 'Come to me. In this, hope
has the final word.
