READINGS FOR THE WEEK

FIRST READING

Isaiah 51. 1 - 6

Listen to me, you that pursue righteousness,
you that seek the Lord.
Look to the rock from which you were hewn,
and to the quarry from which you were dug.
Look to Abraham your father
and to Sarah who bore you;
for he was but one when I called him,
but I blessed him and made him many.
For the Lord will comfort Zion;
he will comfort all her waste places,
and will make her wilderness like Eden,
her desert like the garden of the Lord;
joy and gladness will be found in her,
thanksgiving and the voice of song.

Listen to me, my people,
and give heed to me, my nation;
for a teaching will go out from me,

GOSPEL READING

Matthew 16. 13 - 20

Now when Jesus came into the district of Caesarea Philippi, he asked his disciples, 'Who do people say that the Son of Man is?' And they said, 'Some say John the Baptist, but others Elijah, and still others Jeremiah or one of the prophets.' He said to them, 'But who do you say that I am?' Simon Peter answered, 'You are the Messiah, the Son of the living God.' And Jesus answered him, 'Blessed are you, Simon son of Jonah! For flesh and blood has not revealed this

to you, but my Father in heaven. And I tell you, you are Peter, and on this rock I will build my church, and the gates of Hades will not prevail against it. I will give you the keys of the kingdom of heaven, and whatever you bind on earth will be bound in heaven, and whatever you loose on earth will be loosed in heaven.' Then he sternly ordered the disciples not to tell anyone that he was the Messiah.

Genesis tells us that when God made the world, God looked upon it and saw that it was good. The birds of the air, the creatures of the sea, the animals of the earth, each has its place within the great tapestry of creation.

In Job, when human questions have reached their limit, God turns Job's gaze towards the creatures: "Ask the animals, and they will teach you." There is wisdom here: the world is not silent, but full of voices, rhythms and mysteries beyond our knowing.

Perhaps animals are part of God's way of drawing us back into awe and wonder. A dog's faithful presence, the chorus of birdsong at dawn singing of a sound world, the quiet companionship of any creature beside us, all can become small windows into the larger life of God's Creation.

Today we gather with our pets and animals and give thanks for all these fellow creatures whose lives touch ours, sometimes gently and sometimes profoundly.

Genesis gives us a world that is good, Job gives us creatures who can teach us, and God who made them still invites us to look, wonder and listen.

Perhaps, if we become still enough, we may hear something of the voice that spoke creation into being:

'It is good.'
