FIRST READING

Genesis 50. 15 - 21

Realizing that their father was dead, Joseph's brothers said, 'What if Joseph still bears a grudge against us and pays us back in full for all the wrong that we did to him?' So they approached Joseph, saying, 'Your father gave this instruction before he died, "Say to Joseph: I beg you, forgive the crime of your brothers and the wrong they did in harming you." Now therefore please forgive the crime of the servants of the God of your father.' Joseph wept when they spoke to him. Then his brothers also wept, fell down before him, and said, 'We are here as your slaves.' But Joseph said to them, 'Do not be afraid! Am I in the place of God? Even though you intended to do harm to me, God intended it for good, in order to preserve a numerous people, as he is doing today. So have no fear; I myself will provide for you and your little ones.' In this way he reassured them, speaking kindly to them.

GOSPEL READING

Matthew 18. 21 - 35

Then Peter came and said to him, 'Lord, if another member of the church sins against me, how often should I forgive? As many as seven times?' Jesus said to him, 'Not seven times, but, I tell you, seventy-seven times.
'For this reason the kingdom of heaven may be compared to a king who wished to settle accounts with his slaves. When he began the reckoning, one who owed him ten thousand talents was brought to him; and, as he could not pay, his lord ordered him to be sold, together with his wife and children and all his

possessions, and payment to be made. So the slave fell on his knees before him, saying, "Have patience with me, and I will pay you everything." And out of pity for him, the lord of that slave released him and forgave him the debt. But that same slave, as he went out, came upon one of his fellow-slaves who owed him a hundred denarii; and seizing him by the throat, he said, "Pay what you owe." Then his fellow-slave fell down and pleaded with him, "Have patience with me, and I will pay you." But he refused; then he went and threw him into prison until he should pay the debt. When his fellow-slaves saw what had happened, they were greatly distressed, and they went and reported to their lord all that had taken place.

Then his lord summoned him and said to him, "You wicked slave! I forgave you all that debt because you pleaded with me. Should you not have had mercy on your fellow-slave, as I had mercy on you?" And in anger his lord handed him over to be tortured until he should pay his entire debt. So my heavenly Father will also do to every one of you, if you do not forgive your brother or sister from your heart.'

MESSAGE FROM JENNY – Making Room for God:

Peter asks Jesus a very human question: how many times should I forgive someone? Seven times? That already sounds generous. But Jesus answers, "Not seven times, but seventy-seven times." Forgiveness, Jesus suggests, is not something we can ration or keep count of.

Joseph faces a similar question. His brothers have treated him terribly, and now they are afraid that he will take revenge. Instead, Joseph says, "Do not be afraid! Am I in the place of God?"

Joseph does not pretend that what happened did not matter. He knows what he has suffered. But he chooses not to let that suffering determine what happens next.

That is at the heart of forgiveness.

Forgiveness does not mean saying that something wrong was right. It does not mean forgetting, or pretending that we were not hurt. Sometimes forgiveness takes a long time. And sometimes it means simply leaving the future open.

It means saying: I will not let what happened have the last word. I will leave room for God.

Perhaps this is part of what it means to be rooted in Christ: allowing God's mercy to shape us, so that we can grow in faith and become more fruitful in love. Perhaps it begins with us - with the small, difficult choices through which God's grace slowly changes the way we see ourselves, one another and the world around us.

Perhaps our prayer this week can be simply this:

"Lord, help me to let go of what I cannot change, and leave room for what you might yet do."

May God's grace begin its work in us and through us, one small step at a time.
