FIRST READING

2 Corinthians 9. 6 - end

The point is this: the one who sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and the one who sows bountifully will also reap bountifully. Each of you must give as you have made up your mind, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver. And God is able to provide you with every blessing in abundance, so that by always having enough of everything, you may share abundantly in every good work. As it is written,

‘He scatters abroad, he gives to the poor;
his righteousness endures for ever.’

He who supplies seed to the sower and bread for food will supply and multiply your seed for sowing and increase the harvest of your righteousness. You will be enriched in every way for your great generosity, which will produce thanksgiving to God through us; for the rendering of this ministry not only supplies the needs of the saints but also overflows with many thanksgivings to God. Through the testing of this ministry you glorify God by your obedience to the confession of the gospel of Christ and by the generosity of your sharing with them and with all others, while they long for you and pray for you because of the surpassing grace of God that he has given you. Thanks be to God for his indescribable gift!

GOSPEL READING

Luke 12. 22 - 30

Jesus said to his disciples, ‘Therefore I tell you, do not worry about your life, what you will eat, or about your body, what you will wear. For life is more than food, and the body more than

clothing. Consider the ravens: they neither sow nor reap, they have neither storehouse nor barn, and yet God feeds them. Of how much more value are you than the birds! And can any of you by worrying add a single hour to your span of life? If then you are not able to do so small a thing as that, why do you worry about the rest? Consider the lilies, how they grow: they neither toil nor spin; yet I tell you, even Solomon in all his glory was not clothed like one of these. But if God so clothes the grass of the field, which is alive today and tomorrow is thrown into the oven, how much more will he clothe you—you of little faith! And do not keep striving for what you are to eat and what you are to drink, and do not keep worrying. For it is the nations of the world that strive after all these things, and your Father knows that you need them.

MESSAGE FROM JENNY –

Harvest Message: Fuller Lives

Harvest is a time to give thanks, but it also invites us to ask what it means to have enough.

In the Gospel, Jesus tells the story of a man whose land produces an abundant harvest. His barns are not large enough, so he decides to build bigger ones. Yet Jesus calls him a fool. The problem is not that he has a good harvest, or that he has made provision for the future. The problem is that he has come to believe that having more can finally make him secure. His barns are full, but his life is not.

This is a challenge worth hearing at Harvest. We live in a world where fullness is often measured by what we have. Yet the Christian story begins somewhere else: before anything is ours, it is a gift. The earth, the seed, the harvest and the food on our tables are gifts before they are commodities.

Paul reminds us that God gives us ‘seed to the sower and bread for food’, so that what we receive can become a blessing for others. The harvest is not finished when it reaches the barn. It is finished when it becomes bread: when it is shared, and becomes nourishment and life for someone else.

This Harvest, alongside our thanks-giving, we

might ask ourselves: are the gifts we have received becoming gifts we can share?

The answer is not bigger barns, but fuller lives: rooted in Christ, open to others, and generous with what we have received.
